Purpose of the role
<p>The Widening Participation Officer (WPO) will work within the CUC Bass Coast Team and in collaboration with partner organisations to devise and deliver widening participation activities to nurture aspirations of young people of the region. This includes building key community and university partnerships to promote young people's post-secondary aspirations along with other initiatives to increase local participation in higher education for school age students.</p> <p>In addition to this, they will work with the CUC Bass Coast team to provide a comprehensive range of support strategies in higher education academic and learning skills. This includes engaging students in their learning through a holistic approach to academic support, events and initiatives that promote wellbeing, success and foster a local learning community.</p>

Create, co-ordinate and manage widening participation and outreach programs which increase participation in Higher education throughout our local region.
Deliver widening participation and outreach programs in local schools throughout south Gippsland and the bass coast in collaboration with university partners, community groups and local industry.
Engage with local schools to build strong working relationships between CUC Bass Coast and partner universities and local industry to ensure successful and locally relevant widening participation activities.

<p>Manage and develop relationships with key stakeholders including universities, South Gippsland Bass Coast LLEN, local schools and industry partners to drive a systems-based approach to maximise impact.</p>
<p>Work collaboratively on team projects that support student success, contribute to community-based initiatives, and help achieve the strategic goals of CUC Bass Coast.</p>
<p>Drive Continuous Quality Improvement (CQI) through all widening participation activities with the support of the CUC Central Evaluation Team and university partners.</p>
<p>Contribute to the ongoing evaluation of Widening Participation activities including collecting and analysing local data in collaboration with the CUC and university partners.</p>
<p>Work collaboratively with the CUC BC team and colleagues across the CUC Network to share best practice.</p>

<p>Contribute significantly to the engagement, well-being, and retention of registered students during their transition to study and throughout their course(s).</p>
<p>Provide academic mentoring in referencing skills, writing and assessment skills, study and wellness skills, in areas where appropriate.</p>
<p>Be conscious of students who may be struggling academically and/or personally, or otherwise at-risk of attrition and provide appropriate intervention and referral, in line with CUC protocols.</p>
<p>To be familiar with and collaborate with university student support systems and networks as required.</p>
